and it's called "Stranger Things." So based on the premise of the story, and the positive support it was receiving from friends I trust, I decided to watch it. I've finished the first season and am glad I paid attention to my friends' enthusiasm and recommendations.

When church members become excited about what their church is doing, it becomes easier to tell people about it, and to invite them to check it out. The single greatest reason someone decides to join a church is not because of the quality of the preaching, music, children's programs or outreach, although these things can contribute to that decision. The main reason someone joins a church *is because they have a relationship with another church member, they've been invited to worship or another church function, and they've been warmly welcomed.* And the best way to do that is by being enthusiastic and proud of your church!

I've said it before and I'll say it again: it's a true blessing and honor to serve among a group of people who ARE enthusiastic and on fire for their church! It's a pleasure to see the people of Soddy UMC expressing the love of Christ in their service, hospitality, grace and generosity. I encourage you to keep it up! Let your excitement for your church be infectious to those around you! People *will* notice and they *will* want to know what you're so joyful about.

Why not take a moment and thank God for what he is doing in your church? Ask the Holy Spirit to lead you to people who need to hear your enthusiasm and pride for your church.

Go and tell. Go be enthusiastic. Go be proud of what the Lord is doing among us. *GO GROW YOUR CHURCH!*

## BY THE SWEAT OF YOUR BROW

In September, Americans pause to observe Labor Day. How does Scripture view work?

God created human beings to work in the Garden of Eden and care for it. Work must have been a joyful blessing. With the fall into sin, work became more of a burden. God tells Adam, "By the sweat of your brow you will eat your food" (Genesis 3:19a). Now thorns and thistles would complicate farming. Much sorrow would enter the picture.


Work still represents God's purpose for people. Much blessing and fulfillment accompanies faithful labor. But, like Adam, we toil by the sweat of our brow because of sin in the world. Work problems multiply. Labor-management strife develops. Unemployment affects many. Some work takes a tremendous physical toll. Other work exacts a serious mental and emotional price. Sometimes we let work rule our lives with no room for God or people's needs. Sometimes we devalue work and become lazy, expecting others to provide for us. Both distortions reveal our sinful rebellion against a loving God.

But in our labor we remember Jesus Christ. He is the One who worked with His hands as a carpenter and called to Himself rugged fishermen and tax collectors. He did the work of God who sent Him (John 9:4). In prayer His sweat was like drops of blood (Luke 22:44). He completed His saving work on the cross and rose from the dead.

Jesus knows our needs and our labor problems. He promises to be with us. He restores our work to its joyful significance in God's creation. We continue to toil by the sweat of our brow, but through the sweat we see His face.

# Scripture cake

A divine dessert inspired by ingredients found in the Old Testament

## Ingredients

- 1/2 cup unsalted butter
- 1 1/2 cups sugar
- 1 tablespoon honey
- 3 eggs, divided
- 1 cup figs, chopped
- 1/2 cup almonds, chopped
- 2 cups all-purpose flour
- 2 teaspoons baking powder
- 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 1 teaspoon ground mace
- 1 teaspoon ground cloves
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1 cup golden raisins
- 1/2 cup water

- (1)Preheat oven to 375°. Grease and flour a 10" round pan and set aside.
- (2) In a large bowl, beat butter and sugar with mixer at high speed until light and fluffy. Mix in egg yolks, water and honey.
- (3)In a separate bowl, combine flour, baking powder, cinnamon, mace, cloves and salt. Toss figs, raisins and almonds with flour mixture.
- (4)Beat egg whites until stiff and fold into batter. Spoon evenly into prepared pans and bake until a tester inserted in the center of the cake comes out clean (45-50 minutes).

Let cool completely on a wire rack before serving. Garnish with fresh figs, if desired.
