



### Update on in-person worship

On Thursday, August 27, our Planning & Preparation Taskforce conducted a Zoom meeting to discuss worship services at Soddy UMC. At present, the Scenic South District and Holston Conference continue to suspend in-person worship inside our buildings. However, outdoor worship has been approved for those churches that wish to do so.

Our plan is to begin an abbreviated outdoor worship on Sunday, September 13, at 8:30 AM, in the playground. Please note that if the weather is bad on Saturday night/Sunday morning the service will be cancelled.

You're asked to bring a lawn chair.

Social distancing will still be maintained (so no handshakes, hugs, etc.).

Families will be expected to sit together.

Offering plates will not be passed but will be available for you to drop your offering in.

Due to the brevity of the service, the restrooms/fellowship hall will not be open.

And you will need to wear a mask.

Naturally, if you're over the age of 65, not feeling well, or providing care for someone, you're still encouraged to remain at home. As I've said before, do not

risk your health by trying to return to church too soon. Err on the side of caution as you've been doing.

I will continue to pre-record the sermon and post to Facebook and our YouTube channel for those who aren't comfortable with outdoor worship, or if we have to cancel the service due to bad weather. The outdoor service will consist of a responsive reading, prayers, a creed, a children's message, sermon and benediction. There is to be no congregational singing (again, a conference requirement). The service will last approximately 35-45 minutes.

If you can't make it back yet, no problem. I completely understand. While this isn't the best possible solution, at least it's a step in the right direction. So bring a lawn chair, wear your mask, social distance, gather under the big tree, and let's make church happen!

#### What to expect when in-person worship resumes

- (1) If you're over the age of 65, sick, or providing care for another, you are encouraged to stay home. While we understand the desire to be back at church, your health and well being are more important. *DO NOT come to church until you feel ready to do so.*
- (2) All persons over the age of two (2) <u>MUST</u> wear a mask while in the church building. *Please bring your mask from home.* Social distancing will be maintained. The pastor will not be shaking hands after the worship service.
- (3) Families must sit together and maintain social distancing between the family unit and those around them.
- (4) There will be no congregational singing. Children's time will continue but children will remain with their families. No snacks will be handed out.
- (5) Collection plates will not be passed but will be on hand. Please leave your offering before or after the service.
- **(6) Bulletins will be available but will not be handed out.** You will need to pick one up as you arrive. *Please bring your Bible from home.* Church/pew Bibles will not be available.
- (7) The bathrooms and fellowship hall will not be open.
- (8) The Holston Conference requires us to keep a record of attendance each week with names and contact information. In the event of a reported case of COVID-19 we need to be able to get in touch with all those in attendance that day. Understand this is something we must do in order to reopen, so please be patient if an usher asks for your contact information.



The Holston Conference is still taking online church credit/debit donations.


